- 2. What does Anne name her diary? Why does she name it this?
- 3. Why do the Franks emigrate to Holland?
- 4. Why does Harry end his relationship with Fanny?
- 5. When Anne packs to go into hiding, she writes, "Memories mean more to be than dresses." What does she mean by this? Do you agree or disagree?
- 6. How does Anne feel about her mother? Provide at least one specific example to support your answer.
- 7. Describe Anne's relationship with her father. Who does Anne feel a closer connection to, her mother or her father?
- 8. Who is the first to allow Mr. Dussel to work on their teeth?
- 9. Who are the soup eaters?
- 10. What happens to Peter in the attic? Be specific.
- 11. How does Mummy feel when Anne says she doesn't want her to say prayers with her?
- 12. Why does Dussel say no to Anne's request to use the table twice a week in the evenings? Why is the table so important top Anne?
- 13. Why does Anne mention that Dussel is 54 years old?
- 14. What does Moushie give them?
- 15. What is one reason why the Van Daan's are arguing?
- 16. Margot asks Daddy if he would like to give Anne a children's Bible for Chanuka so Anne could find out more about the New Testament. What does this moment imply about the family's religious convictions?
- 17. Why is it significant that Anne writes about her fountain pen being cremated? What might this foreshadow (provide a clue)?

- 2. Whom does Anne think Peter belongs to? Why?
- 3. Explain why Anne's feelings about the Van Daan's change.
- 4. Why is Anne noisy and boisterous?
- 5. What do you think Peter thinks of Anne? Explain your answer and provide a reason from the text that supports your answer.
- 6. Identify one characteristic about Peter that attracts Anne.
- 7. What does Anne say she does and doesn't want from people?
- 8. What is gone to never return?
- 9. How does Anne say to deal with misery or unhappiness? How does Mummy say to deal with this?

- 10. What war rages inside of Anne?
- 11. What are the little children of Holland now doing?
- 12. Anne says she wants to go on living even after her death. Do you think that has happened? Why or why not?

April 11, 1944-July 21, 1944

- 1. Why does Anne say they were protected by God?
- 2. How do the characters react to not being found by the secret police?
- 3. Identify the two characteristics Anne says she must require of herself.
- 4. What does Anne say helps her keep her head about water?
- 5. Explain the significance of the date April 15, 1944.
- 6. Describe the heat the family feels in the secret annex.
- 7. Who is getting too familiar with Mrs. Van Daan?
- 8. Explain the significance of June 6, 1944. How does this day make the characters feel?
- 9. Identify at least two traits of Peter's that disappoint Anne.
- 10. Does Anne feel like she knows her father on a personal basis? Why or why not? Be specific.
- 11. In your opinion, how does Anne change during her time in hiding?
- 12. Describe how Anne and the others must have felt at being found by the secret police.
- 13. On May 22, 1944, Anne wrote, "What one Jew does reflects on all Jews." Create your own definition of a stereotype. What stereotypes from this book still exist, and what new stereotypes have formed since this book's publication?
